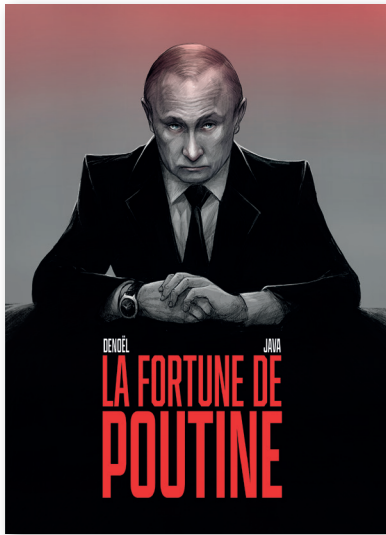

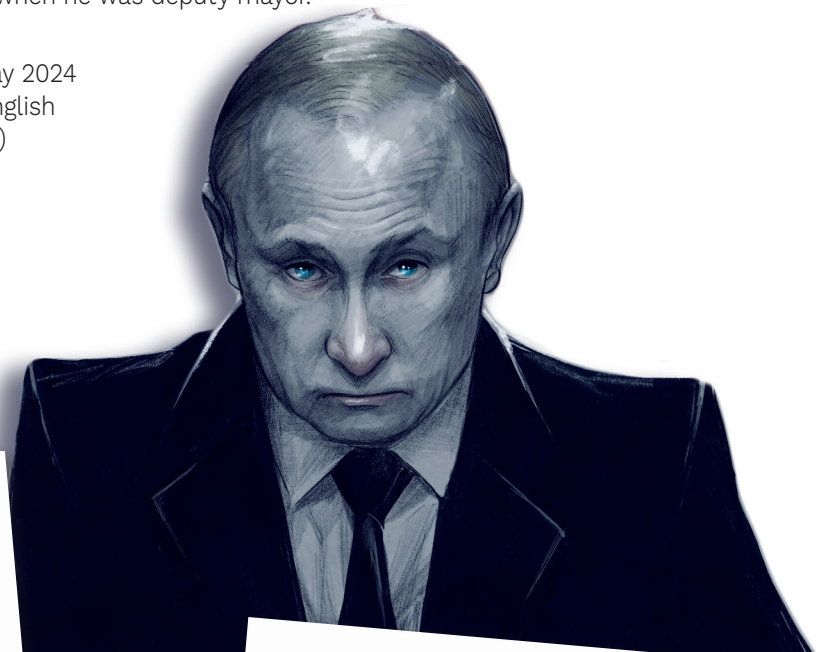


Putin's Fortune

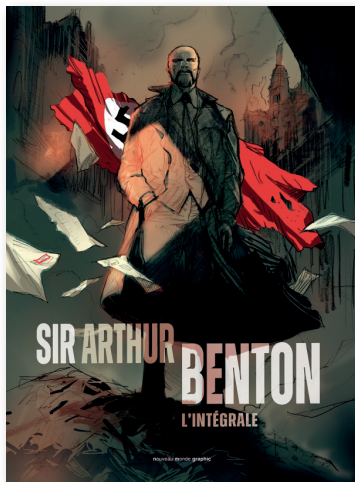
Julius Caesar's Gallic War

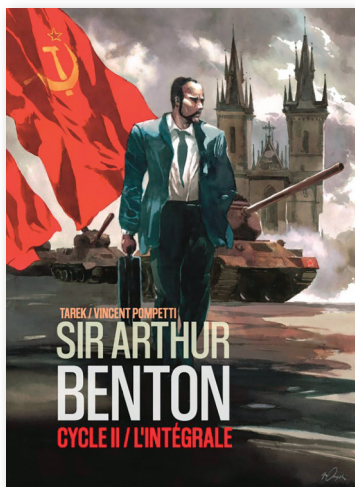

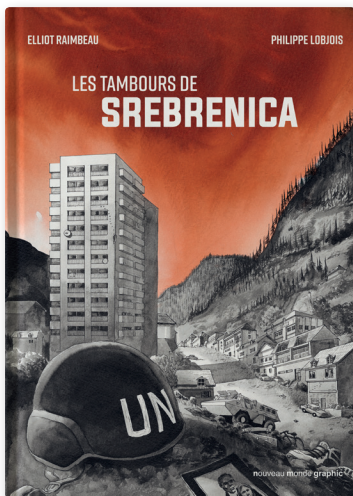


Who Broke the Enigma Code?
