### German Women Resistance Fighters

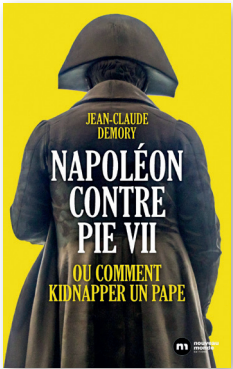
Women Facing Hitler

In this way, she sketches out a new history of German resistance, largely unpublished thanks to hitherto unexploited documentation.

### Napoleon Against Pius VII

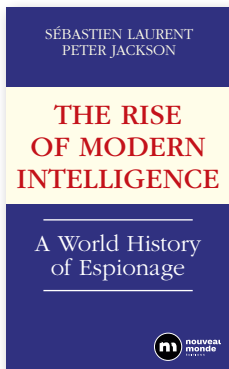
How to Kidnap a Pope

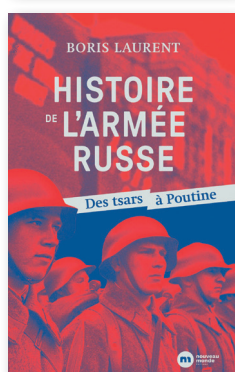

### From the Tsars to Putin. A Global History of the Russian Army (1917-2024)

Few armies in history have aroused so much fear. In just over 100 years of existence, the Red, Soviet and then Russian army has had several lives: the army of the revolution under the aegis of Trotsky, the German-Soviet conflict from 1941 to 1945, which brought the Red Army to the brink of collapse... From 1954, the Soviet army shook the world during the Cold War. It was followed by the Russian army, the one that came down from the Wall in 1991, chaotic, miserable and bogged down in Chechnya. Finally, the army shaped by Vladimir Putin, from the 2000s onwards, has been reorganised and today puts Russia back on the chessboard of international relations. However, it has serious shortcomings, which were highlighted in Ukraine.

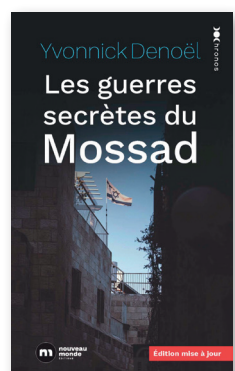
#### Girls and Places of Pleasure in 19th-Century Paris

All these places of prostitution, solicitation and rendezvous shaped the city's geography and contributed, for a long time, to making Paris the capital of love and pleasure.

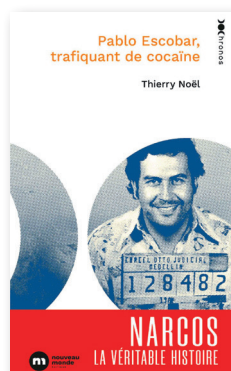
