When it comes to Marilyn Monroe, you'd think that everything has been said. On closer inspection, however, we discover that we're swimming between poorly portrayed fiction, second-hand biographies, slapdash documentaries and pseudo-investigations full of "revelations", even when we're dealing with well-established authors such as Norman Mailer and Joyce Carol Oates. This book does not pretend to establish the truth about Marilyn. It takes on the more modest task of not confiscating her voice. In so doing, it perhaps paradoxically allows us to get closer to her. By basing itself on the most solid sources, and by carrying out a verification process – so uncommon when it comes to her – the outline of a portrait emerges.

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
